

Truck route established in Minnewaukan

The Minnewaukan City Council has announced that truck routes have been established in the city now that Minnewaukan's paving project is nearly complete. Four streets in the city have been designed for handling heavy truck traffic, including grain trucks.

The streets designed for truck traffic are Main Street from U.S. 281 west to the city limits; West Avenue from N.D. 19 to Main Street; East Avenue from Main Street to Third Street; and Third Street from East Avenue to West Avenue. The streets are designated on the map which appears on this page.

Truck route streets have a heavier mat of asphalt on them. Other streets do not have such a heavy mat and could be damaged by loaded trucks traveling over them.

There will be some exceptions to the truck routes, such as the fuel oil truck, milk truck, garbage truck, etc. Those who have any questions on this may contact Chief of Police Carl B. Cooper. Signs will be installed in the near future to mark truck routes, no parking areas and speed limits.

Many of the streets in Minnewaukan have been made narrower as a result of paving. Because of this, angle parking will be permitted only in the following places; on Main Street in front of businesses; the Main Street entrance to the bank; the east side of D Avenue in front of the school; and the north side of St. Peter's Church. All other parking in town will have to be parallel and within 12 inches of the right hand curb.
